Our vision is for all people with learning disabilities and autism to be full and equal members of society.

- Positively encouraging self-advocacy and promoting people with learning disabilities and autism as leaders.

- Offering paid and voluntary roles within the organisation.
- Empowering people with learning disabilities and autism to bring about positive change in services and the community.

Our Work

Advocacy in Greenwich has been supporting people with learning disabilities and autism in the Royal Borough of Greenwich for 32 years

- We have well-established networks across the local community and voluntary/statutory sectors.
- We maintain strong connections with neighbouring boroughs and organisations.
- Our team shares workspaces and meeting rooms with the Volunteers Centre.

- The organisation is Disability Confident committed, and the CEO will work towards achieving Level Two
- The CEO will lead a dedicated staff team, including:
 - 4 core staff members
 - 5 consultants (employees with learning disabilities or autism on zero-hour contracts)
 - 7 MPs (employees on zero-hour contracts)
 - Approximately 7 volunteers
 - On average 4–8 freelance advocates
