### How much do you love your newsletter?

### Raising Awareness at Arrowe Park Hospital

Great way to start off Learning Disability Week 2024! We were seen by patients and hospital staff as we set up stall at Arrowe Park hospital again. The team from the hospital Patient Experience Strategy asked us to do some surveys with staff about Hospital Passports for people with learning disabilities. They also wanted the staff to tell them what they thought about the new things the Patient Experience Strategy had introduced.

Alex came in the afternoon. Alex has recently achieved a certificate to deliver the Oliver McGowan Mandatory Training Programme to Health and Social Care professionals and is very aware of the need to improve health services for people with learning disabilities. He said, 'I really like doing the stall at the hospital. It is important to let people know about what we do. It is also important to talk about Health Passports for people with learning disabilities. The Health Passport is important because it tells Doctors and Nurses about what we have difficulty with when we go into hospital'.

It was a busy day. We met one of the hospital's new Safeguarding and Complex Care Practitioners Helen who is a qualified Learning Disabilities Nurse. Another staff member also

called Helen, gave us a brand new sample of the Sensory Care Bags for adult patients with learning disabilities or autism. They will be available for anyone visiting the Emergency Department or A&E. Both great ideas for making sure people with learning disabilities get good quality care at the hospital.

Thank you to everyone who came and did a very important job at the hospital that day.

## Remembering David Walker

On the 8<sup>th</sup> July we were informed of the sad passing of David Walker after a brief admission to hospital. Our condolences go to the Walker family who have a long history with Wirral Mencap.

David's parents, George and Margaret, ran the original social club on Monday nights at Oxton Congregational Church before the Crossbow Club began. David was another of the founder members of Crossbow back in the late 60's and he will be remembered most for his keen interest in aeroplanes and ships on the river Mersey. David loved air shows and attended many around the country and enjoyed visits to Manchester Airport's viewing gallery to watch the planes take off and land. He kept up to date with ships on the Mersey, via a magazine, and knew when all the important cruise lines were in Liverpool. David was quite an independent traveller who liked to be out and about



and made good use of public transport until more recently when arthritis restricted his mobility.

David was a quiet and undemanding character who would blend into the background but enjoyed being amongst friends. He joined our outings and was a regular member of the annual holiday group to Devon where he particularly liked to enter the bowls competition. We will all miss David after such a long association with the Club and the wider organisation.

David's funeral will take place on Friday 9th August at 11.30am at St Marks Church, New Ferry, then moving on to Landican at 12.30pm.

Places are limited to those in transition. Book early to avoid disappointment. Bookings open in September 24!



# In July Wirral Mencap delivered a new workshop to parent/carers.

We have had a lot of requests recently from parent/carers asking for support with Court of Protection -Deputyships. In July our information Advice & Advocacy Team delivered a new workshop to help parent/carers to understand the application process and what they needed to do.

We had a lot of people interested in this workshop which meant some people had to be put on a waiting list. Wirral Mencap will be running two extra workshops on the Court of Protection-Deputyships at the Send Preparation for Adulthood Festival at the Floral Pavilion, New Brighton, on 8<sup>th</sup> October 2024. The workshops will be limited to parent/carers of someone with a learning disability transitioning from Children's Services to Adult Services. 
