### **Role description**

### Responsibilities:

- Map care laws, guidance and regulations across the UK to help build and maintain the knowledge of the team, and to update our information resources
- Undertake ad hoc research on social care issues arising through our advice service and write briefings for the team
- Design surveys, analyse the results and write reports (both internal and external), and help to monitor key performance indicators
- Monitor the care landscape and keep the team updated on relevant social care developments
- Attend meetings and events to represent the charity and promote our services, and develop relationships with key stakeholders
- Assist with communications, including helping to manage our social media accounts, updating the website, drafting blogs and content for newsletters
- Work closely with team members to ensure our research work aligns with services, policy and campaign work
- Assist in the delivery of the operational plan and fundraising plan, including inputting to funding reports
- Undertake other duties that may be necessary from time to time

- Good communication skills and ability to communicate clearly in writing to a range of audiences
- Strong organisational skills and ability to prioritise competing tasks and deliver to tight deadlines
- Experience of working independently, working on own initiative and maintaining motivation
- Experience of working effectively as a member of a small team and a positive, problem-solving approach
- Excellent IT skills, including internet research and a good knowledge of Microsoft Office programmes
