About the Jesuit Refugee Service

The Jesuit Refugee Service UK is part of an international Catholic organisation, working in more than 50 countries to accompany, serve and advocate for the rights of refugees and other forcibly displaced people.

In the UK we have a special mission to people who are made destitute by the asylum system and people held in immigration detention. We believe in the intrinsic dignity of every person and work with refugees from across the world regardless of their race, gender, religion, or politics.

Our holistic services are co-produced with our refugee friends, shaped by their experiences and grounded in restoring dignity and agency to people rebuilding their lives.

Every year, JRS UK works with over 300 refugee friends from more than 80 different countries. Our work includes:

- **Practical support**, providing free food and toiletries, financial assistance, and mobile credit
- **Advice and casework** for those experiencing destitution including support to access healthcare and other services
- **Classes and activities** such as English lessons, music & drama sessions, prayer groups, and our social drop-in, a safe space where refugee friends can come for a hot meal
- **Accommodation** for refugees who are homeless; this includes our *At Home* hosting scheme, which matches refugee friends with individuals, families, and parishes, as well as two houses for longer-term accommodation
- **A legal advice service**, helping people progress their asylum case and find a long-term resolution to their situation
- **Detention outreach**, assisting people in immigration detention with casework and practical support
- **Research and advocacy**, raising awareness of policy issues that shape refugees' lives and experiences

JRS UK is recruiting full-time Fundraising and Communications Officer as part of our Communications, Fundraising, and Advocacy team.

You'll be part of a mission that restores dignity, hope, and agency to people rebuilding their lives after displacement. Whether you're crafting a fundraising appeal, sharing stories on social media, or meeting with refugee friends to help supporters understand their experiences, your work will have real impact. If you're passionate about justice, creative in your communication,

and eager to build meaningful relationships, this is your chance to make a difference every single day.

Job description

1. Supporter engagement:

- Thanking and recording donations; maintaining up-to-date supporter records
- Supporting outreach through JRS UK events such as our Advent Service and report launches
- Representing JRS UK at external events such as Greenbelt festival or the National Justice and Peace Network conference
- Undertaking talks and appeals in parishes or schools

2. Digital and Offline communications:

- Producing and distributing printed materials (e.g. quarterly newsletters; publicity materials; parish resources)
- Maintaining and developing JRS UK's digital presence (e.g. website; social media; e-updates)
- Capturing and managing digital assets (such as audio, photographs, and videos)
- Developing content for JRS UK's website, newsletters, and social media – scoping and drafting content that champion refugee voices, shares our work, or engages supporters in our advocacy
- Analysing web traffic and social media engagement to inform future activity

3. Appeals

- Supporting the delivery of JRS UK's three direct-mail appeals (Advent, Lent, World Day of Migrants and Refugees) and our annual legacy appeal by:
 - Researching and drafting content
 - Curating and segmenting data
 - Sourcing and producing visuals

4. Trust fundraising

- Stewarding relationships with some small and medium sized trusts
- Drafting and submitting grant applications and reports

5. Other duties as required by the Communications and Fundraising Manager or Head of Communications, Fundraising and Advocacy

Person specification

Essential

- A passion for improving the lives of people seeking sanctuary in the UK
- Excellent interpersonal and supporter-care skills
- Excellent writing skills
- Excellent IT skills
- Visually creative, with a keen eye for design
- Familiarity with Salesforce or a similar CRM platform
- Ability to meet concurrent deadlines in a dynamic environment

Desirable

- Experience of working in a fundraising team
- An understanding of the challenges faced by refugees in the UK
- An understanding of the Catholic community in the UK
- Good working knowledge of Canva
- Experience of producing content for social media accounts

Hours: Full-time (37.5 hours); some weekend work undertaking fundraising appeals in parishes will be required as part of this role
