## Frequently Asked Questions

### 1) What is the difference between a Community Activator and a Freelance Facilitator?

#### Community Activators

The Community Activators role is specifically for our Wavemakers Programme, which is aimed at 16-25 year olds. Selected candidates will be trained in delivering the Wavemaker workshops, which already have set content and resources. This role requires you to source your own connections and workshops – this is why this role pays higher than the General Freelance Facilitator Role, as it takes into account the extra work needed for this.

#### Freelance Facilitators

This role could involve working across all 3 of our Youth Engagement Programmes (Earthcubs, Ocean Academy and Wavemakers). This would be on an ad-hoc basis, when we need extra people for an event or workshop. For this role, we would contact you if we need extra people for an event that we have already booked in, we'll do all of the admin and send you in the right direction. Some of these events might be workshops, but they also might be stall events at big festivals. As there is no sourcing of the event/workshop in this case, the freelance facilitator role is paid as a standard day rate, just for the work you do on that day.

### 2) How much work will I get as a Community Activator or Freelance Facilitator?

Again, the Community Activators role involves sourcing your own workshops, so how much work you get is up to you. The freelance facilitator role is done on an ad-hoc basis, so we can't guarantee how much work you'll have each month, as every month is different based on the engagements we've got booked in.

### 3) I am not based in the UK, but the job description mentions remote work – can I apply to become a Community Activator?

Currently our funding for the Community Activator role is restricted to the UK (this includes Northern Ireland), so we won't be hiring any Community Activators from outside of the UK. However, international candidates are welcome to send a speculative application, and we can keep your details on file as we are always looking for international opportunities as well.
