ABOUT THE SCHOOL OF INTERNATIONAL FUTURES (SOIF)

School of International Futures (SOIF) is a global non-profit collective of practitioners in strategy and policy for current and future generations.

Our vision is a better, fairer, more sustainable world for current and future generations. We achieve this by empowering people to use participatory futures and foresight to drive societal transformation through their organisations, communities, and countries.

We are a values-led organisation. We have always worked with people using foresight to create positive change and hope. And our approach ensures that the end of any foresight journey is rooted in impact. We improve outcomes at three different levels:

- Citizens are involved in shaping their desired futures: citizens especially next generation voices — have the power to make and shape their desired futures by participating in decision-making.
- Organisations and sectors are prepared for the future: Organisations, social movements and sectors can engage with upcoming signals of change and navigate an uncertain future
- Leaders make intergenerationally fair decisions: Leaders are supported and enabled to take the interests of future generations into account in their decisions.

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR

We are looking for a Finance Lead to support our agile and values-driven non-profit business to grow whilst balancing financial sustainability. Reporting to the Operations Director, this role will involve working with our Senior Management Team to shape our financial strategy, deliver our plans, and improve the way we work. You will manage a financial accountant. They carry out all routine finance processes and this role is focussed on quality assurance, finance strategy, and



developing our approach to managing grants. We use Xero for our financial platform and most of our financial management tools and reporting are in Google Sheets, slides, and docs.

We achieve impact by bringing together self-employed contractors to work on projects and grantfunded programmes for international clients who are in a position to make decisions affecting future generations - often governments, multilaterals, or foundations. We are a non-profit and we invest any surplus back into our goals.

Our approach to resourcing teams, the international nature of our work, our funding sources, and our mixed business model covering surplus-generating and non-profit activities all bring complexities. We need to carefully manage this blend of work to cover our infrastructure and running costs. The proportion of our funding from grants has grown in recent years and we need different policies, processes, and practices for our grant-funded and contract work. We are looking for somebody who can both help us to manage our current business effectively and develop our financial strategy and approaches to align with the evolving mix of work, especially on grant funded programmes.

You will be experienced in working at a strategic level, ideally within a smaller organisation (<50 people). This means you will be equally comfortable making decisions and pitching in yourself to get things done. You will have experience in setting up and managing finances for grant-funded programmes and the confidence to apply this knowledge to SOIF's particular circumstances. You will also have a breadth of experience - across management accounting, financial controls, forecasting, financial statutory compliance, managing cash flow, short-term treasury management, and liaising with auditors, clients/partners, and external experts. This role is a great opportunity for somebody up and coming looking for a stretch or somebody experienced and looking for a more meaningful role.

Whilst our team and clients are international, our business is registered in the UK and this role requires experience in UK accounting and legal frameworks. Experience working with an international client or partner base would also be beneficial. Above all, you will be a creative thinker and problem solver who is confident using your own experience and commissioning expert input to come up with simple frameworks to address any new challenges that our exciting portfolio of work brings.
