Our services include one-to-one, group, family and bereavement support, as well as a specialist teen support service.

About the role

As a Fundraiser working with Families Out Loud, you will play a key role in securing funding that supports the charity's Purpose and Vision. You will be an energetic person who is passionate about building relationships to leverage and maximise grant income. Working within our values of Listen, Care, Be Practical and Show Determination, the key responsibilities of the role are:

- Identify, plan and secure funding through one-off and multi-year grants from a diverse range of local and national funders
- Write strong, fluent grant applications that illustrate the Purpose, Vision and Values of the charity
- Establish and nurture relationships with funders
- Work collaboratively with the Trustees and the Marketing Coordinator
- Provide end-of-project reports
- Develop and maintain a good understanding of the charity's services
- Any other duties relevant to the role
