WELCOME LETTER FROM THE CHAIR OF TRUSTEES

We are looking to recruit a new committed Trustee who can use their experience and expertise to guide and drive the charity forwards on the next stage of its important journey.

Every year, around 200,000 16-year-olds miss out on gateway qualifications at school, limiting their options for further study and within the world of work. Without a 'standard pass' (grade 4 or above) in GCSE English and maths, young people are drastically more likely to drop out of education and are locked out of many university courses, apprenticeships, and key professions. On average, they will lose out on over £100,000 in earnings over their lifetime.

This raises a significant challenge for social mobility in our country. These young people are disproportionately from disadvantaged backgrounds. To break the cycle of inequality, it is essential that this moment at age 16 doesn't limit their future opportunities. These young people need a strong offer of extra support – beyond what they received at school – to gain the qualifications they need to progress to their next steps.

We know that having a tutor to provide tailored support and rebuild confidence can get students back on track – but too often, the cost of private tuition is out of reach for many young people in further education. **Get Further exists to change this.** We are the first charity dedicated to helping students from disadvantaged backgrounds to gain gateway qualifications in further education and get back on track. We have an award-winning tuition programme, delivered by subject-specialist English and maths tutors. Our tutors provide tailored one-to-one or small-group tuition to students retaking GCSE English or maths in further education or studying for Functional Skills qualifications so that they can progress to a high-quality apprenticeship. Our tutors build confidence and skills to support students to secure the gateway English or maths qualifications that open doors in education and work.

It is an exciting time to join our Board of Trustees. The charity formed in 2018, after winning the Teach First Innovation Award – a nationwide competition to find the best new ideas to tackle education inequality. From a small successful pilot, we have grown our reach to over 2,000 students this year and are now delivering our programmes across the nation. We play a critical role in delivering extra, high-quality tutoring to young people who missed out on the grades they need while at school, and who would otherwise not be able to access this support. After our first five years of rapid growth, we are now in the process of developing our next five-year strategy, which will guide the charity on this next crucial stage of its journey. The overarching theme of this will be improving programme quality and impact for the Further Education and Apprenticeship sectors. A key enabler of this will be creating a robust fundraising function in the charity, diversifying our income from grants in a sustainable way.

ABOUT GET FURTHER

Get Further is the first charity dedicated to providing high-quality tuition to students facing challenges in further education, adult education, and the apprenticeship sector. We aim to transform the experience of these students, helping them to build their skills and realise their aspirations for education and work.

Every year, 200,000 children – disproportionately from disadvantaged backgrounds – do not achieve the expected standard in crucial English and maths qualifications while at school, locking them out of many university courses, apprenticeships, and key professions.

Twice as many disadvantaged 16- to 18-year-olds go to further education colleges than school sixth forms, and yet for too long, the needs of students in further education have not taken centre stage in education policy or funding. We work in partnership with further education providers to prove that, when given the means, all young people can build the skills needed to progress in education and work.

WHAT WE DO

Get Further is an award-winning charity that helps students from disadvantaged backgrounds to pass the gateway English and maths qualifications they need to progress in education and work. We are the only non-profit organisation offering tuition to young people in the Further Education (FE) sector. We focus our efforts here because young people studying in further education are disproportionately from disadvantaged backgrounds.



We deliver tailored one-to-one or small-group tuition, building student confidence and skills to support them to secure the gateway English or maths qualifications that open doors in education and work. Small group tuition is proven to be the most effective intervention for improving outcomes, fast.



We recruit, train and place **subject specialist tutors** in further education settings, who deliver our **bespoke English and maths curricula** and establish positive, **mentoring relationships** with the young people they support.



We are an **influential voice** that drives improvements across the further education sector, through disseminating our positive impact and practice.

OUR PRIORITIES AND SCALE

With the fallout from Covid-19, now, more than ever, young people need extra support to help them progress to their next steps in education and work. We know that having a tutor to provide tailored support and rebuild confidence is one of the most effective ways to help students close gaps in their knowledge, but too often, this is out of reach for the poorest young people in further education.

By the end of 23-24, we will have matched over 2,000 students in 30 colleges, sixth forms and independent training providers, to top tutors and will have delivered over 11,000 tuition sessions. Approximately two thirds of the young people we support meet at least one disadvantage indicator¹.

KEY BIOGRAPHIES

SARAH WAITE - CEO AND FOUNDER



Sarah began her career teaching maths, seeing first-hand the difference that gaining GCSE maths and English can have on the opportunities that are available to young people. Sarah has also worked as a Political Advisor to the Shadow Education Secretary and as Head of Policy at the Social Mobility Commission – where she started developing the idea for Get Further, recognising that improving levels of basic skills is a key social mobility challenge for our country.

In 2018, Get Further won the Teach First Innovation Award – a nationwide competition to find the next big ideas to tackle education inequality. Sarah is a

Shackleton Leader and was shortlisted for the inaugural Virago/New Statesman Women's Prize for Politics and Economics. She has a first-class degree in mathematics and was awarded a distinction for her Masters in Education.

MICHELE SUTTON – CHAIR



Michele is a former Principal and Chief Executive of several further education colleges including in Rochdale, Bradford, Birmingham and London. She has also represented the FE sector in senior positions including as a FE National Leader of Governance and President of the Association of Colleges, for which she was awarded a CBE in 2014. She is also Vice-Chair of the Association of Education Advisors (AOEA). Michele is committed to equality of opportunity, especially for students from diverse backgrounds and cultures, and for her work on this issue she was awarded an OBE in 2009.

DR. CHRIS WILSON – TRUSTEE



Chris is a Director and Co-Founder of ImpactEd Group (IEG) which supports education charities and multi-academy trusts to maximise their impact and develop sustainable business models. At IEG we support purpose-driven organisations with evaluation, strategy, people and communities, philanthropy, and governance. Natasha is the founder and Chief Executive of Unlocked Graduates – a charity that attracts high-calibre graduate talent to work in the UK prison service. Natasha has a background in public sector start up and was previously a teacher and senior leader in inner city schools. This included co-founding King Solomon Academy and leading their frontier cohort to groundbreaking GCSE results in 2014. Natasha has also worked as a government adviser and in the Westminster think tank Policy Exchange.

In her spare time, Natasha is an advisor to the Children's Commissioner, Commissioner for The Times on their Crime and Justice commission, and a charity trustee at Impetus PEF and Get Further. She also sits on the Grants and Evaluation committee at the Youth Endowment Fund and the Building Future's Advisory Board at Prison Reform Trust. In 2022 Natasha was awarded an OBE for services to HM Prison and Probation Service.

SALARY: Unremunerated (reasonable travel expenses will be paid)

LOCATION: Meetings are mostly remote, but we aim for at least one in-person meeting per year in our

TIME COMMITMENT: Four Board of Trustees meetings per year (2.5 hours each) & sub-committee

meetings (2 hours each) depending on your area of expertise.

TERM: Three years in the first instance, with the possibility of one further term

MAIN TRUSTEE DUTIES:

Governance

- Ensuring the financial stability of the charity, protecting and managing the charity's assets
