# **Roles & responsibilities**

You do not need to have any formal training in this sector – just a genuine interest! We will provide training and mentoring for skills development.

#### **Essential duties**

- Participate in the coordination and administration of the panel

- Monitor Heal activity and give recommendations for inclusion improvements
- Develop relationships with diverse groups & individuals
- Develop inclusive volunteering opportunities
- Develop inclusive event offers

# Commitment

We're asking for a **2-year commitment** to this role, which is entirely voluntary. We understand that circumstances can change and we will always do our best to be flexible and accommodating.

The regular time commitment is approximately **4 to 10 hours per month**. Some months may be busier or quieter than others, allowing you the flexibility to determine your level of involvement.

Here's a rough breakdown of the time allocation:

- Every other month: Zoom meetings on Tuesdays from 6-7pm
- 4-6 hours a month: independent work in a group or on individual projects
- Annual summer site visit/campout (initial kick off this summer)
- Annual winter city meetup
- Participation in Heal Live events (if possible)

All expenses for this role will be covered (travel, subsistence).

The role of the Heal Future Advisory Panel is vital to Heal Rewilding. Therefore, we kindly ask individuals to carefully consider their availability and capacity before committing.

- Why you are applying explain what your motivations are for applying to this role
- Your ideas for how you can support Heal Rewilding share big and small ideas for what you could do as part of this role

Successful applicants will proceed to the next recruitment stage, which includes an informal video call with Julia.

# Equity, diversity and inclusivity
