Job Overview:

As a full-time member of the Impact team, you will help drive forward the implementation of the impact monitoring programme for Summer Isles Enterprises (SIE) and the Tanera project. Based on a remote 800-acre island, this role is ideal for those passionate about making a difference through community-driven projects and environmental sustainability. The project is large-scale and exciting, involving a creative, diverse workforce delivering an ambitious programme of restoration and working towards a long-term hospitality and charitable offering. Tanera represents an excellent opportunity to jump-start a career in social value.

The primary purpose of this role will be to help capture and communicate the social value and effectiveness of the services and projects delivered by SIE for the Jagclif Charitable Trust in our areas of charitable engagement: rural regeneration, environmental protection & improvement, health & wellbeing, education, and arts, culture, heritage & science.

The key deliverable for the Impact team will be a report due in early 2025 on the social value created by the Trust's investment in the Tanera project to date. This will entail maintaining a careful balance between measuring qualitative and quantitative data, with an emphasis on storytelling using the data gathered. This report will be centred on our focus areas of rural & community regeneration and the provision of care for people in public service (health & wellbeing).

Key Responsibilities

You will help to build and maintain a library of high-quality data, imagery, and stories.
- <u>Stakeholder Engagement</u>: You will help maintain active engagement with project stakeholders to understand what changes for them and to enhance our community initiatives and environmental efforts, guided by the strategic framework developed by the Impact Working Group.

About You:

Personal qualities and skills that will help you succeed in this role include diligence, proactiveness, self-motivation, and flexibility; the ability to build good working relationships with colleagues, clients, and project teams; proficiency in English communication skills, both oral and written; strong organisational skills and the ability to prioritise competing elements within your own workload with minimal supervision; and a high level of attention to detail.

You will be interested in the social impact of large-scale projects in remote rural areas and be willing to spend time on the island and with the teams delivering the project for SIE. You will ideally have experience living and working in remote, small communities. You will be comfortable working with people with a range of different backgrounds and communication styles. Experience of the Northwest Highlands would be beneficial.

<u>Career Aspirations</u>: This role is ideal for candidates at the beginning of a career in impact reporting, social value measurement, community development, or project management, who are looking to make a meaningful contribution under the guidance of experienced leaders and external advisors.
