

Youth Minister (Part-time) | Woodlands Central

Background

At Woodlands Church Family (WCF) we currently engage over 200 young people through our churches and events each week, with over 90 of those at our Central congregation. Our Central youth ministry currently comprises a large Friday night youth gathering, monthly united youth services, Sunday morning discipleship groups, a mentoring programme and schools work connections. We also have a packed programme of weekends away, trips, Youth Alphas, socials and summer camps throughout the year.

Role Description

We are looking for someone who can work alongside the Senior Youth Director, established Youth Team and Congregation Leaders to help our youth ministry double its impact in the next 5 years. Within this role, the Youth Minister will help inspire and equip the Youth Team within Central to share faith, disciple and equip young people to live lives of whole-hearted devotion and commitment to Jesus.

We envision this will be through implementing our strategy to

Connect>Explore>Respond>Grow & Go

CONNECT - develop new outreach initiatives to connect with unchurched young people.

EXPLORE - discover ways to help those young people explore faith in and encounter Jesus for themselves.

RESPOND - provide opportunities for young people to respond to the Gospel of Jesus.

GROW & GO - lead settings where young people can GROW & GO into the lifestyle of the kingdom.

Key Relationships

We would love to see you develop, build and nurture relationships both within and outside of the church, that can see young people's lives changed by encountering Jesus. Developing key relationships with team, young people and parent/carers will be essential to see this potential reached.

This role will require working alongside the existing full-time Youth Minister, with a team of incredible volunteers. You will also be working collaboratively with other WCF youth ministers from other sites as well as other youth workers in the city.

Training and Development

We are committed to lifelong learning as well as investing and developing our team. We have training packages available for successful applicants, including theological training from level 3 through to BAs and PGDip which can be arranged to fit alongside your role.

Induction phase -

We invite all new staff to adopt a learning posture as they get to know the church culture, the team and the city. The first few months will be intentionally spent shadowing other members of the team and working alongside the Senior Youth Director and full-time Youth Minister. Your responsibilities will then gradually increase during the first 12 months to take on the roles outlined in the job specification.

Area of Work	Responsibilities
1. Outreach to the City	Support and help the Central Youth Team to: a. Deliver any WCF schools related work. b. Plan and deliver youth provision at connected WCF Church plants.



	c. Create spaces and events which help unchurched young people explore faith and connect with the church family. d. Build relationships with and work alongside other youth organisations serving the city.
2. Develop & Deliver Youth Programmes	Together with the WCF Senior Youth Director, Central Youth Minister and Youth Team: a. Prepare and facilitate termly discipleships programmes and special events for Central youth. b. Ensure quality Sunday youth provision with a biblical curriculum at Central. c. Support the co-ordination and delivery of WCF cross-congregational youth events, weekends away, camps and mission trips. d. Provide appropriate support for young people with additional needs. e. Ensure good communications with young people, parent/carers and other practitioners. f. Work closely with the safeguarding team to ensure our youth provision is safe.
3. Youth Discipleship & Development	Together with the WCF Senior Youth Director and Youth Teams help to: a. Create safe places, where young people belong and feel connected. b. Facilitate a variety of discipleship opportunities for Central youth including mentoring. c. Develop the worship and prayer life within youth ministry. d. Support the identification and development of young people's gifts e. Develop opportunities for young people to connect with the wider church family.

4. Champion & Grow Youth Ministry	At Woodlands Central help the congregational team and Senior Youth Director to: a. Support cross-congregational youth ministry opportunities and connections, including being part of WCF Youth Team meetings. b. Support the life of the church family c. Promote youth ministry and ensure it is visible, engaged and represented. d. Develop team life and volunteering opportunities to grow our youth ministry and outreach. e. Support the team of youth volunteers

- Self-motivated and able to take initiative.
- Teachable and humble - with a willingness to learn and take on feedback.

- Able to relate to all ages/backgrounds.
- Ability to share your faith effectively.
- Good biblical knowledge and the ability to teach.

- Experience of recruiting, motivating and managing volunteers.
- Experience organising and structuring events/initiatives/teams.
- Good upfront communication skills i.e. public speaking & preaching.
- Relevant qualifications e.g. youth work, first aid.
- Theology qualifications & training.

- Good administrative and IT skills.
