About the Service

Age UK Birmingham is a delivery partner for the Dementia carers hub, providing carer groups and activity across Birmingham. The project aims to connect with carers who are supporting people living with dementia. Each group is designed around the needs of the carers and offer support through activity, peer support, and awareness. If you enjoy making a real difference, and supporting people through a trying journey, then this is this volunteering opportunity is for you.

Travel expenses will be paid via an expenses form on a monthly basis.

About the Role

Our carers hub volunteers are responsible for facilitating the running of the weekly group providing conversation, running of activities, and assistance in setup/shut down.

Specific tasks may include:

- To undertake the volunteering induction program including relevant training
- Keep a record of attendance
- Support the setup of the room ready to welcome clients
- Coordinate activities where required
- Provide assistance with house-tasks including serving refreshments and dish washing
- Suggest and plan suitable and engaging activities in the groups
- Establish, maintain and develop relationships with clients by chatting and ensuring a positive atmosphere
- Report any concerns about users to the service manager
- Attend team meetings as required
