
XLP

XLP is a vibrant youth work charity dedicated to shaping bright futures for young people. Leading the charge against poverty and educational failure in inner London, we offer holistic, long-term support to 11 to 25 year olds in both schools and communities.

Over the past eight years XLP has run a nationally recognised mentoring programme which runs in nine London boroughs. These mentoring projects target at risk young people between 11 – 18 who are on the verge of exclusion or excluded from school, at risk of involvement or already involved in crime, and isolated from their communities. The aim is to support these young people and help them see alternatives to what can sometimes seem a hopeless situation.

We're looking for a Mentoring Manager to join the team to recruit, train, monitor and supervise mentors sourced from the local community in North London. These mentors commit to providing 1-2 hours face to face per week for a minimum of 12 months with their allocated mentee.

This is a hybrid role with approx. 50% of your time being face-to-face. Mondays are based in our central London office.

WHAT YOU WILL BE DOING

- Manage a caseload of up to 20 active 1:1 mentee / mentor relationships at any one time;
- Work with local community organisations and networks to recruit volunteer mentors;
- Work with schools, community stakeholders and the wider XLP team to identify young beneficiaries for mentoring;
- Build relationships with parents / families / guardians and assess a young person's needs and appropriateness for the programme via home visits;
- Provide training to mentors and carefully match them with young people;
- Provide ongoing support to mentors throughout the programme and assist in creating exit strategies upon conclusion;
- When matches cannot be found, mentor young people yourself;
- Work with local schools to deliver group mentoring sessions;
- Facilitate social interactions for mentors.
- Ensure that agreed practices, protocols and procedures are followed particularly relating to safeguarding;
- Report on the required aspects of the project to XLP and external funders;
- Undertake quality and performance management to ensure that the young person receives a positive experience, that monitoring records are maintained accurately and that progress towards the desired outcomes is evidenced;
- Ensure that the project operates within budget and that financial procedures are followed.
- Plan, organise and manage the annual residential weekend away, in collaboration with other Mentoring Managers;
- Organise day trip activities in partnership with other Mentoring Managers.



WHAT YOU BRING TO THE ROLE

You will be passionate about creating positive futures for young people in inner-city London and seeing transformation in their lives.

You'll be good at:

- Volunteer, Project and Caseload Management;
- Leading others, with a passion for growing and enabling people;
- Self-motivation and willing to go the extra mile;
- Working with and training Volunteers;
- Working with at-risk young people through schools, community or social work;
- Using your own initiative.

Useful if you have:

- Extensive previous experience of working with children and young people;
- Hold a recognised youth work qualification or have equivalent experience;
- A track record of mentoring and/or counselling projects;
- A strong network of relevant contacts.

We are committed to providing ongoing training and support including Clinical Supervision for all our staff for them to develop and thrive in their roles.
