Role at a glance:

Supporting our intergenerational social action programme which connects young people with their older neighbours in retirement homes. Delivering regular intergenerational workshops and designing activities for younger and older generations to tackle social issues in their communities.

This role is supported by the <u>Jack Petchey Foundation</u>. Successful candidates will be part of the Jack Petchey Internship Programme where they'll have access to professional development workshops, a training bursary and mentorship.

About InCommon

InCommon is a charity bringing generations together. We connect groups of young people with their older neighbours in retirement homes to learn and build friendships together. Our activities help to improve wellbeing for participants of all ages and build more connected, inclusive and age-friendly communities.

We are currently a dynamic team of 7, supported by a Trustee board. We partner with schools, youth groups, housing associations and other community organisations to connect people of different ages in meaningful ways that benefit everyone taking part. Since 2017, we have helped more than 2,350 people connect with someone from a different generation and older people have volunteered over 2000 hours sharing their knowledge, energy and experience to support young people's learning.

Our three main activities as an organisation are:

- **The Connect Programme** connecting primary age children with their older neighbours in retirement homes.
- Intergenerational Social Action Programme supporting younger and older people to come together to lead and create positive change
- **Training, support and consultancy** supporting other organisations with intergenerational practice. We are currently developing an online platform to support more grassroots intergenerational projects to happen around the country.

About the role

As a Programme Officer, you will be supporting the delivery and growth of our Social Action programme, connecting young people from schools and youth groups with older people in retirement homes across Greater London.

The role will enable you to gain frontline experience of youth led intergenerational work and drive forward real social change. You'll be joining InCommon at an exciting time of our development, with opportunities to shape our Social Action programme and make a difference to communities across London.

You will also be part of the <u>Jack Petchey Internship Programme</u> - a training and development opportunity designed for young people who are starting out in the charity sector.

Benefits of the Jack Petchey Internship programme include:

- Joining a cohort of 30 other interns from different youth organisations in London and Essex
- Partaking in four professional development workshops throughout the year
- Attending a residential launch conference for the internship programme and end of programme celebration event

Your responsibilities

Supporting the delivery of regular intergenerational workshops in retirement homes

You will be supporting at our in person workshops, and you'll work towards being the lead facilitator on our Social Action programmes across London and the South East. You'll bring energy into the room whilst sensitively considering and accommodating the different needs of the participants, both young and old.

Supporting the design and development of our programmes

You'll work closely with the Programme team to keep our intergenerational programmes fresh, stimulating and relevant for all age groups taking part. You will support the creation of resources that are tailored to and co-created with young people. Alongside this, you will engage with younger and older participants to generate new ideas, respond to feedback and ensure we're delivering a delightful and accessible experience.

Support all aspects of programme delivery

You will work hard behind the scenes to make sure our programmes run smoothly, keeping our systems updated, preparing workshop materials and coordinating with the Programme team in weekly meetings.

Building and maintaining strong relationships with people of all ages

Using your strong communication skills you'll build relationships with everyone taking part in an InCommon programme, from young people and older people to school teachers and staff working at the retirement homes.

Being the go-to friendly face for partner organisations

You'll be the main point of contact for some of our partners, from head teachers at primary schools to management teams at the retirement homes. Your efficient, thoughtful and conscientious approach will build trust and lead to close working relationships.

Promoting InCommon to our wider network

You'll help our Communications Manager keep InCommon's social media and communications fresh and up to date, creating new content that's relevant for our audiences.

The Jack Petchey Foundation provides funding to support young people in London and Essex and we would therefore expect applicants to have a strong connection with London or Essex and ideally be currently living in the area.
