It has been another extremely challenging year for Raystede. We have experienced the highest number of requests ever from people needing to give up their pets and a slowdown in rehoming as people struggle with the ongoing cost-of-living crisis. We can only continue caring for the animals who so desperately need us, thanks to you, our incredible staff and volunteers, and your passion, hard work and dedication.
