- UK medical research funding agencies (such as Innovate UK, Medical Research Council and National Institute of Health Research, arm's length bodies such as Genomics England and contacts in research funding agencies within devolved nations etc.)
- People affected by type 1 diabetes

Key tasks:

- Identify opportunities to increase and improve type 1 research in the UK consistent with our research priority goals and programmes and work with the Breakthrough T1D research team to lead our involvement in these areas.
- Work with the Director of Research Partnerships to raise JDRF's profile within the UK
 medical research community and maximise opportunities for existing and future research
 programmes across the UK to be relevant to and aligned with the priorities of JDRF's
 global research strategy.
- Support and develop the Connect Immune Research partnership, working with existing
 partners to move forward on the Connect Immune Research ambitions, developing new
 collaborative opportunities and working to bring new partners on board.
- Work with the Head of Research Operations to make new research partnerships and funding opportunities practical, deliverable and appropriate to the UK research community.
- Manage meetings that will bring together UK researchers in academia and industry to encourage the development of collaborations and partnerships that harness UK



- research strengths to answer the research challenges posed by our international research strategy and the needs of people with type 1 diabetes in the UK.
- Network with relevant scientists and clinicians to identify new research opportunities
 that fit within our global research strategy and encourage and support more
 researchers to apply to our funding opportunities and to other appropriate sources for
 research funding.
- Act as a representative for the charity and an advocate for the needs of people with type 1 in a variety of settings, from fundraising and policy events to research meetings and industry events.
- Provide on-the-ground insight about the type 1 diabetes research environment in the UK, and insight about policy, regulatory and payer attitudes relevant to our mission to colleagues in the Breakthrough T1D research team.
- Liaise with research counterparts in Australia, Canada and other international affiliates to help identify and facilitate type 1 diabetes-relevant activities beyond the UK.
