A NOTE FROM OUR FOUNDER & DIRECTOR



It feels like only yesterday that I muddled my way through my first laptop refurbishment in the depths of lockdown - a battery replacement of my mum's dusty old Macbook Air (2014) which I delivered to a young refugee who was applying for Medicine at Kings.

Since then a community of people has since gathered around me - people who are big-hearted, generous, motivated and cognizant of one simple fact: there are simple solutions to the problem of digital exclusion.

I speak on that community's behalf - the journey has been stimulating, fun, purposeful, frustrating, demanding, and rewarding. That has been the impact for those of us on the ground who are using our time and skills to convert discarded tech into future-defining tools for those on the margins of society.

In the pages that follow you can read about the impact these efforts have had on those seeking sanctuary in the UK. Some have used their new devices to submit university assignments, apply for meaningful employment and share important documents with their lawyers. Others have taken on remote volunteer roles while they wait for months in the asylum system. Some have built refugee charities with their new devices, others have used it to watch Johnny English.

Digital inclusion isn't rocket science but its impact can be completely life-changing. The only way to truly understand the personal impact that a laptop has for a particular individual is to throw yours in the bin.

I hope you enjoy reading this report as much as we enjoyed compiling it, and I invite you to join us on our mission, with hope and without delay.

OUR MISSION & VISION



Screen Share's mission is to support, inform, and advocate for the digital inclusion of refugees and people seeking asylum in the UK.

There are more refugees in the world than ever before, including in the UK. We provide laptops, data packs and digital skills training. Digitally including refugees is not only the right thing to do - everyone has the right to be connected and free from social isolation - but it's also part of the answer to the difficult policy questions asked by the global increase in the movement of people.

The provision of tech and tech skills is different to the provision of food or shelter. It is a tool for the recipient to use to build their own future on their terms. It is vital in the modern day.

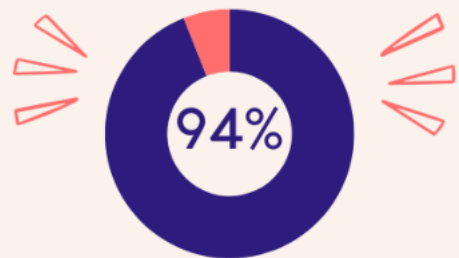

WHAT IS THE NEED?

The digital divide disproportionately affects refugees and asylum seekers and does so with greater consequences when it does. The refugee community in the UK faces a pronounced digital access discrepancy due to financial constraints, with individuals receiving only £5.80 a day and limited employment opportunities, leading to isolation and mental health challenges.

The gift of a laptop is a life-changing tool. Our intervention provides internet-enabled devices as a lifeline, offering pathways to education, language acquisition, skills training, and renewed purpose. By extending access to digital resources, we empower refugees to engage fully in society, fostering successful integration and future contributions as active citizens. This access not only enhances well-being and happiness but also opens doors to increased health, income, and the potential for a brighter future within the UK community.



DIGITAL ACCESS PROJECT

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Screen Share's core programme from January 2021 to the present day has been the Digital Access Project. In this project, Screen Share sources and receives laptops from incredibly generous donor partners and individuals, refurbishes them using skilled tech volunteers, and redistributes them to refugees and people in the asylum system as a permanent gift at no cost. We do this predominantly through partner organisations but when we have extra capacity, we open up to other organisations within the sector as well as self-referrals.

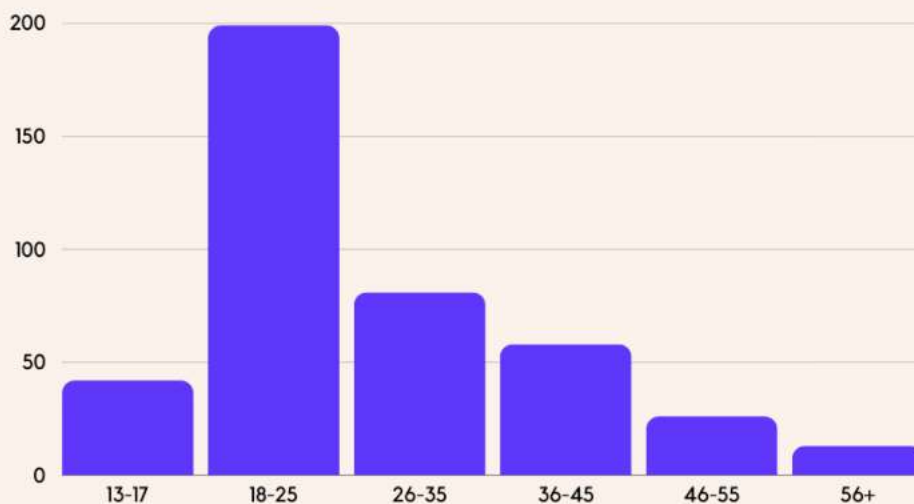
Our team is comprised of 2 part time members of staff, our Director and our Digital Access Project Coordinator, and over 30 active volunteers. Our tech team, comms team and runners are made entirely of volunteers and perfectly demonstrate the power of volunteer time. Our volunteers spread Screen Share's mission, prepare high quality tech, and hand deliver laptops to their new owners.



WHO DO WE WORK WITH?

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Screen Share supports anyone in the UK who has experience of forced migration. This includes refugees, people seeking asylum, those issued with humanitarian protection visas and stateless individuals. Originally founded to address the need among young people in London of this demographic, we have since expanded in response to the extensive need across a broad age range around the UK.

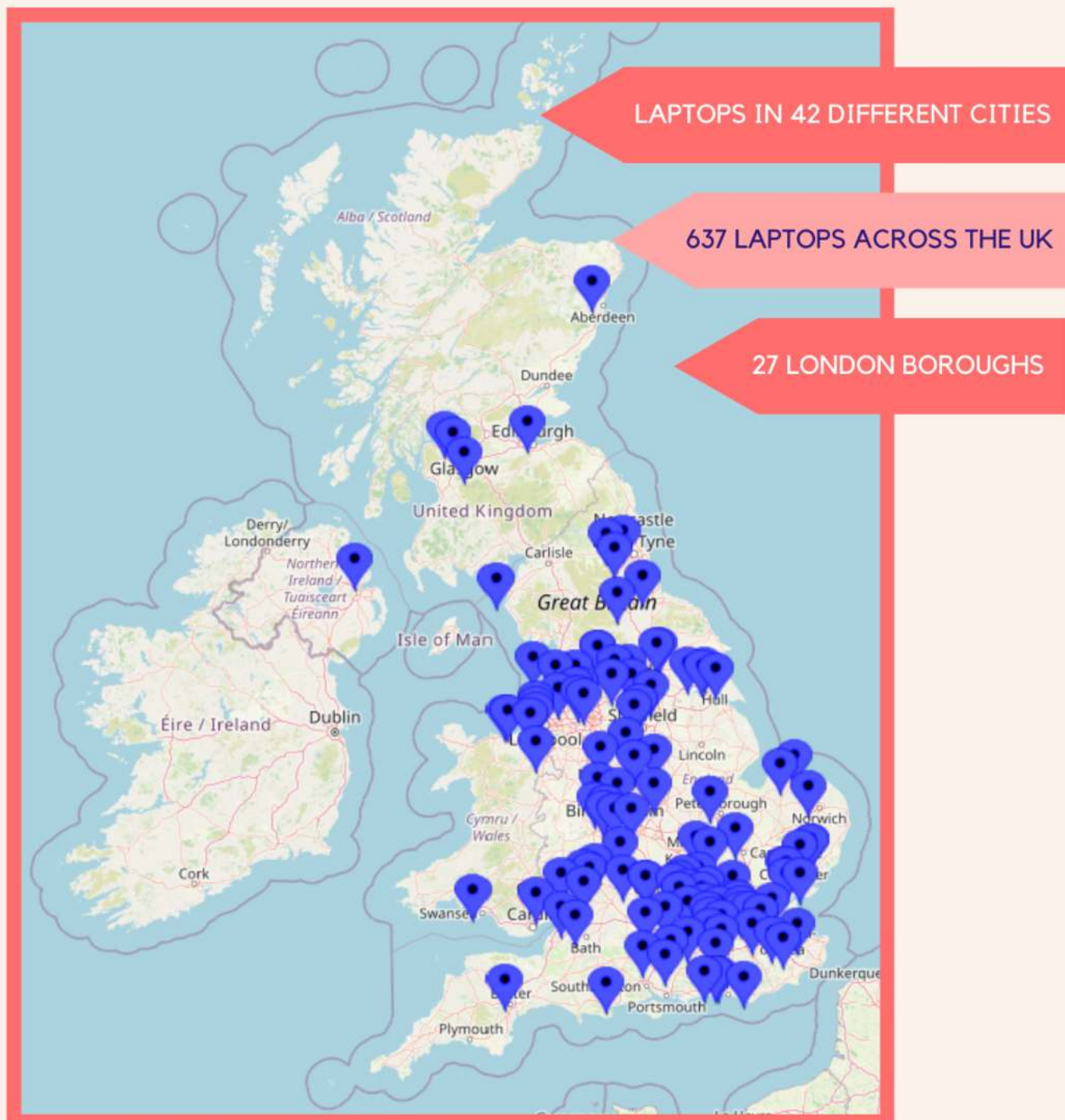

WHERE DO WE WORK?

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Screen Share is the only refugee digital inclusion organisation which supports sanctuary seekers across the whole of the UK. We started in London and many of our volunteers are based in the capital, but in 2023 only 35% of laptops went to people based in London.



THE IMPACT

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Laptops are used for a variety of reasons. Whilst most are used for education, they have also played a pivotal role in exploring employment and volunteering opportunities, as well contributing to people's overall wellbeing.

Some of our highlights have been providing 16 students on University of Leicester's RefugEAP programme, which teaches refugee students academic English. We have also provided laptops to Safe Passage Young Leaders, who campaign to for change in policies which affect refugees. One was even used to build Bablyon Project, a Community Interest Company which runs creative activities by and for young people from refugee, asylum seeking and migrant backgrounds. We have also enjoyed building partnerships with local councils and large refugee charities where we have delivered a large number of devices at short notice.

"I got an email from University of Warwick few months ago, and I needed to write an essay in order for me to get admitted to University. my laptop keyboard wasn't working and I had only few days till deadline, I didn't know what to do, I thought I wouldn't be able to get to University just because I didn't have access to working computer. By help of REUK I got referral to screen share and they sent me a working laptop in two days. since then because screen share I was able to write my essay and submit it in time.

Not only I got admission to University of Warwick, I got Sanctuary scholarship as well, all this was made easier for me because I had access to laptop thanks to Screen share. I am hoping to use the same laptop which was given to me by screen share and graduate from University.

As a Asylum Seeker I faced A lot of challenges trying to get access to higher education, having no access to internet and working computer made everything difficult for me. I think everyone deserve to have access to higher education and little thing such as having access to a simple computer can make tremendous difference in Asylum Seekers life. I was able to finish my assay just in time, but what if I couldn't get access to computer? I would have lost my chance to join University this year, by simply not having access to working computer it even sound unfair and sad that by just having access to working computer a life can be changed."

DIGITAL SKILLS

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A barrier many face in accessing the digital world and accessing the support that they need is digital illiteracy, an unfamiliarity with how devices and the online world works. After 2 and a half years of contributing to the digital inclusion of refugees through laptop provision, we wanted to make sure we were helping people feel confident in using their new devices.

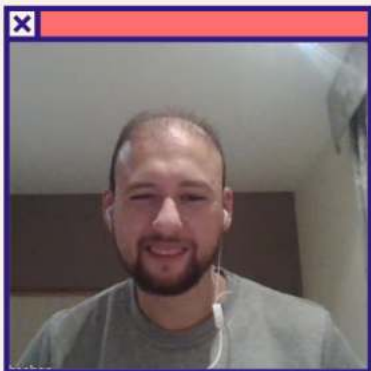
In July 2023 we partnered with Conversation Over Borders, a CIC that offers free online English classes and mental health support, to pilot 1-1 online digital skills classes. Classes followed a 6 week curriculum which included topics such as online safety and configuring laptop settings.

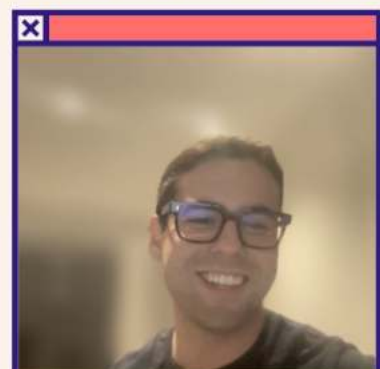

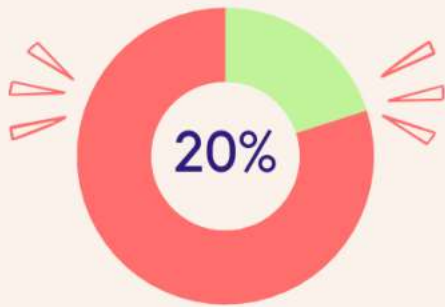

ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT

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In 2019, a year before Screen Share was born, almost 54 tonnes of e-waste was produced. Only 17.4% of it was recycled correctly ([WHO 2023](#)). The UK is ranked as the second worst country when it comes to e-waste production ([Uswitch 2023](#)).

Through the power of refurbishment and repair, our Digital Access Project converts laptops that were destined to be tech waste into life-changing gifts. We have worked with over 16 environmentally conscious companies and have transformed their disused staff laptops into useful and long-lasting tools. 637 laptops amounts to 1847kg of e-waste saved, adding up to a massive 2048kg of CO₂ saved. Our savings equal a 564km car ride which is just over how far Glasgow is from London!
