
SENIOR YOUTH WORKER SOUTH EAST / BUS GREENWICH | LEWISHAM

XLP is a youth work charity working to create positive futures for young people and at the cutting edge of tackling poverty and educational failure in inner London. We deliver holistic, long-term work with young people aged 11 to 25 in schools and communities.

We're looking for a Senior Youth Worker to join our South East team. You'll work across Greenwich and Lewisham, with a particular focus on delivering face to face youth work in schools and community projects. You'll also drive one of our buses, for two days a week.

You will have a special responsibility for our Sydenham Hub where you will lead Bampton Bus Session, run our Exclusion Reduction Program in the local school and will be responsible for driving one of our buses to and from projects twice a week. Our buses act as mobile youth centres and provide a unique and rare platform to engage with young people on a weekly basis.

For this role you will need to have held a UK driving licence for more than two years. Full bus driver training will be provided.



- Deliver XLP's schools work in at least two schools / PRUs (Pupil Referral Units) in the borough;
- Engage young people through a combination of 1:1 mentoring, group mentoring sessions, and 6-8 week programmes, all supporting those who are at risk of exclusion;
- Use Salesforce to input, track and review progress with each young person accessing the schools work.
- Deliver detached, community-based youth work via regular weekly sessions, activities and trips, occasional weekend residentials:
- Communicate effectively with project leaders across XLP:
- Coordinate the delivery of projects in our Sydenham hub
- Identify and discuss new opportunities and initiatives with the team.
- Carry out home visits to families to deliver 1:1 support sessions;
- Frequent driving of the bus to and from its base of operations and the community locations;
- Detailed planning and coordination of all the bus facilities and the programme of activities for your projects;
- If the bus breaks down, contacting roadside assistance and staying with the vehicle until it is recovered;
- Ensure that all project activities for which you are responsible are delivered in accordance with agreed health and safety, equal opportunities, and safeguarding policy and procedures.
- Work closely with stakeholders in our Sydenham Hub
 - o Strong collaboration/partnership with the local school
 - o Parents, local authorities and other social work professionals;
 - o Key partner organisations in the borough including local churches and other youth provisions.
- Work with the Volunteer Manager to lead, motivate and support teams of volunteers and apprentices to deliver the work within their respective areas;


- Working with young people, with experience in an inner-city environment;
