Meningitis Research Foundation is a leading UK and international charity working to defeat meningitis wherever it exists.

Founded by individuals whose lives were profoundly affected by meningitis, we are dedicated to enabling positive change by uniting people, funding research, and sharing knowledge to save lives.

Meningitis strikes quickly and can affect anyone of any age. We provide direct support to people and families affected by meningitis because no one should have to go through this disease alone.

Since the 2021 launch of the World Health Organisation's first ever global roadmap to defeat meningitis, an ambitious new phase of development is underway for the charity. We believe there has never been a more exciting time to join our team. We value imagination, effectiveness and productivity in our work and provide an encouraging environment for enthusiastic, dedicated staff to grow.







Meningitis and Me - Mike

Mike contracted meningitis and septicaemia and spent 10 weeks in ICU, which resulted in having his four limbs amputated. He is now the UK's tenth person to receive a double hand transplant. Mike is a valued ambassador for MRF and works in partnership with us to tell his story and not only advocate to defeat meningitis around the world but to also inspire hope for those affected.

"I'm just Mike - and that's how I think of myself. It's coming back to that acceptance".

About our student programme

Our student events are responsible for a significant proportion of our events income, with around 200 students each year taking on a once in a lifetime charity challenge such as climbing Kilimanjaro, trekking to Everest Base Camp or running the Budapest Marathon.

The student events team is sector-leading. Our fundraising in this area is well established and we have been offering challenge events that students can embark on for over 13 years. As a charity, we have been working with universities for almost 35 years, which is an important element of our work due to students being at higher risk for the disease.



The Student Fundraising Assistant is a new role at MRF, with lots of variety and opportunities to network with universities, students and RAGs.

Weekly 1-2-1s and monthly in depth catch ups with your line manager to ensure you are developing in the role

Induction meetings with colleagues from across the organisation to understand what we are doing to defeat meningitis

Regular opportunities to meet with the whole fundraising team for in depth project development and training sessions

Who are we looking for?

You are a people person

This role is all about connecting with people, and encouraging them to take on a fundraising challenge. You will be happy talking to new people every day. You will need to be enthusiastic, outgoing and thrive in motivating people to take action.

You are passionate

You will need to be an advocate for Meningitis Research Foundation's work to defeat meningitis when working in universities and talking to students. It is through the determination of everyone involved with the student events programme that we are able to deliver a number of our goals as a charity.

You are a skilled communicator

We are proud of our quality supporter communications, social media pages and on-campus participant recruitment. Your role will involve a lot of chatting to people, motivating them to sign up, answering questions and making phone calls. You will be happy to present to groups of students about Meningitis Research Foundation and deliver lecture shout outs on campus.

You like to collaborate

Whilst you will need to use your initiative and sometimes work independently on campus, you are part of a strong team. You should enjoy working with your colleagues to make the most of every opportunity and each other's strengths.

You love variety

Everyday in the student fundraising team is different and you will need to be flexible and adaptable. This isn't a fully desk based job and you will be out on the road working with universities on campus, attending freshers fairs, information meetings and speaking to potential student fundraisers both face to face and on the phone.



You want to make a difference

Every year, there are more than 2.5 million cases of bacterial and viral meningitis around the world. 1 in 10 people who get meningitis will die. Around half of these deaths are in children under 5 years old. We are driven to change this by 2030 in all that we do. We promise to continue to raise awareness and be there to support people who have been affected. If this excites you, then you could bring a lot to this role.

Job description – Student Fundraising Assistant

Job purpose and summary

To work as part of our student events fundraising team in recruiting participants for our student overseas treks and other student events.

This post is part of the Meningitis Research Foundation student fundraising team. You will work with universities and students across the UK, to maintain positive relationships with university partners and recruit student volunteers to take part in international fundraising challenges.

Meningitis Research Foundation is based in Bristol but the role is flexible and is open to anyone wishing to work remotely.

Reports to

The Senior Fundraising Manager will be responsible for your post and will ensure you have been given appropriate support and development to you in your role. However, you will also be working directly with our student fundraising team who will ensure you are given briefing on your responsibilities and assign tasks to you.

Key tasks and activities

- Visiting partner universities around the UK to promote their chosen fundraising challenge. These promotions include but may not be limited to; manning freshers fair stalls, flyering and delivering lecture shout outs.
- Maintaining positive relationships with the universities visited through good communication skills.
- Generate interest in the work of Meningitis Research Foundation and motivate people to register their interest in a challenge and sign up.
- Deliver short presentations at information meetings about the work of Meningitis Research Foundation and the fundraising support we offer to challenge participants.

- Make telephone calls to students who have registered interest in a challenge; answering questions, assisting with concerns and helping to overcome barriers to entry such as fundraising targets.
- Occasional need to assist challenge leaders, RAGs or societies with social media content e.g. Instagram stories or posts using Canva.

General, personal & developmental responsibilities

- Support colleagues and communicate your work and needs openly and effectively.
- Establish efficient and effective working relationships and communication with internal and external stakeholders.
- Take responsibility for your own development and training needs, in consultation with line manager.
- Keep abreast of the work going on in other teams, and any important developments in the field of meningitis and meningitis-related sepsis.

How to apply

The closing date for completed applications is 9am on Tuesday 16th July 2024.

Interviews will be held remotely via Microsoft Teams the week beginning Monday 22nd July 2024. We advise you to submit an early application with the strongest chance of securing an interview. The interview will include a short presentation task, which you will be told about prior to the interview. Terms and Conditions - Essentials

Location

The Meningitis Research Foundation office is based in Bristol, with the full address of Room 703, The Programme Building 7th Floor, The Pithay, Bristol, BS1 2NB. However this role is open to anyone wishing to work remotely. There will be frequent travel to universities across the UK.

Salary

£23,000 (pro rata) including 2% employee pension contribution + 6% employer pension contribution.

Paid in arrears on or around the 25th of each month.

Contract type

Full time, fixed-term (4 months).

Hours of work

36.25 hours between 8.00 am to 6.00 pm Monday to Friday, with frequent unsociable hours. Work completed outside your regular working hours can be claimed back through time off in lieu.

Overnight stays are likely when visiting universities. These can also be claimed back in line with our TOIL policy.

Leave

25 days annual leave pro rata.

Expenses

Travel, accommodation or other sustenance (food/drink) related to university visits will be reimbursed in line with our expenses policy, or will be booked for you.
