About Us

In November 1986, siblings Paul and Jean O'Gorman were both diagnosed with cancer, and both tragically lost their lives within months of each other.

On the day that 14-year-old Paul passed away, the O'Gorman family made him a promise to help other children and young people facing the same situation. Their first goal was to raise £100,000 for research and support. Since then, Children with Cancer UK has grown into one of the leading children and young people's cancer charities in the UK.

In those 35 years, we've created better, kinder treatments, helped the public and the scientific community understand childhood cancer better, and raised over £300 million.

That money has supported thousands of children and their families through treatment and beyond and funded over 300 research projects into the causes of childhood cancer and seen survival rates grow from 67% to 85.2% with fewer toxic side effects.

We are in a new phase of growth and are investing in our teams to expand our reach, grow our awareness and deliver greater income to ensure we can continue funding essential research into childhood cancer. Our vision is a world where every child survives cancer.

We also support families while they go through cancer treatment, and while they navigate life after it. How do we do this?

- By funding programmes that provide financial support for families facing childhood cancer, including expenses for accommodation, and travelling to and from the hospital.
- By offering 'amazing days out', including trips to the circus and theme parks. Our activities offer some light relief from treatment, creating pockets of fun, joy and lasting memories of time spent together as a family, away from the hospital.
- By providing them with the tools, resources, and network they need to feel confident and empowered during this chapter of their life.

Main purpose of position

To support Children with Cancer UK (the Charity) with excellent supporter care, effective data entry, batching, banking and thanking donations and also provide administration for team enquiries. The majority of the role will be to process supporter donations accurately and quickly, plus be the first point of contact for supporter queries to the charity via phone, email and in writing.

Background information

Children with Cancer UK is the leading national children's charity dedicated to the fight against childhood cancer. Our aims are to determine the causes, find cures, improve treatments and provide care for children with cancer.

Our work started with a promise.

We were founded in 1988 following the death of 14-year-old Paul O'Gorman to leukaemia and, just nine months later, his sister Jean, also to cancer. Before his death Paul's parents promised to help other children with leukaemia and, today, we fund life-saving research into childhood leukaemia as well as all other forms of other childhood cancers.

- We fund life-saving research to improve our understanding of childhood cancer and to find safer, more effective treatments for all young patients.
- We fund innovative welfare projects to help children and families in their fight against childhood cancer.
- We campaign and raise awareness of childhood cancer, to protect more children and give more young cancer patients a brighter future.

Key priorities and relationships

- To log and update supporter details onto the database accurately and quickly.
- To deal with queries by letter, email, or telephone appropriately and in a timely fashion.
- To take donations over the phone.
- To batch donations received to the charity via cheque, bank transfer, voucher, cash and via online platforms onto the database accurately and quickly.
- To write thank you letters, and other correspondence as required.
- To effectively cross sell fundraising during contact with supporter as agreed in the supporter journey (as appropriate)
- When required, sort incoming post and distribute to the relevant teams and people in the office in a timely fashion.

Duties and Key relationships

- To answer telephone queries relating to other departments as necessary.
- To volunteer at our charity events when required e.g. London marathon, special events, etc.
- To assist the team and manager in any other duties as required.
- To deal with queries from supporters affected by cancer and to refer them to other external sources if necessary.
