We are looking for someone who has demonstrable experience in designing, setting up and maintaining a user-friendly and efficient supporter database and who has a deep commitment the local church and the unique role they can play in helping children who struggle. The successful candidate will have strong data management and analytical skills and be passionate about understanding trends and patterns from our marketing activities and donations.

As our Supporter Development Data Manager, you will maintain and oversee our Supporter Development and Marketing data. This might be data relating to our amazing hope givers or specific marketing campaigns that it's critical we are storing safely and efficiently. You'll work in collaboration with our Head of Marketing and Audience Engagement and CRM configuration analyst to ensure optimal and effective solutions are deployed and that our data is up to date and available for regular reporting across the organisation. You may be working with our communications team one day, and with our partnerships team the next, so we're looking for an individual who can build strong working relationships.

The successful candidate will have the opportunity to attend our semi-annual staff conference, team days and integrate fully into our friendly and dynamic staff team. We're passionate about seeing individuals grow in all God has called them to, and we'd be excited to see how your skills and experiences could help us bring hope and a future for struggling children. TLG is a Christian charity and, as a team, we want to bring our faith to the work we do; as such, we are recruiting an individual with a strong and vibrant Christian faith. Job Tasks

Data Collection, Management and Analysis:

- Maintain and oversee Supporter Development and Marketing data, ensuring all data is accurate, up-to-date, clean and compliant.
- Work with the Head of Audience Engagement and Marketing to scope and assess the most effective and efficient ways to collect, process, analyse, and report on data, feeding it into day to day activities.
- Support the SD team to track donations to key fundraising appeals, campaigns, fundraising events etc.
- Manage data flows across our different platforms and support the implementation of automation processes where appropriate.
- Work closely with departments across the organisation, specifically Communications, Marketing, Church Partnerships and Volunteer Programmes and respond to internal requests for fundraising data analysis and reporting.
- Create monthly reports on fundraising and marketing performance across comms activities to share with the team and embed best practices in future fundraising content.
- Ability to work closely with the CRM configuration analyst to implement
- Line Management of the SD Administrator.

Fundraising and Donor Optimisation:

- Work strategically to optimise fundraising communications and reporting.
- Integrate data analysis into digital fundraising strategy.
- Analyse the performance of fundraising campaigns and recommend improvements.
- Segment audiences for fundraising and marketing campaigns based on various criteria (e.g., donation history, demographics) through managing datasets.
- Develop predictive models to forecast future donations and help identify potential major donors.
- Use data to tell compelling stories that resonate with donors, supporters, and the public.

Continuous Learning and Compliance:

- Stay up-to-date with data analytics tools, techniques, and best practices to enhance your skills and contribute effectively.
- Ensure that data handling practices comply with data protection regulations (e.g., GDPR)
- Be mindful of ethical issues related to data usage, especially when dealing with sensitive information data.

Additional Responsibilities

- Attend, fully participate in and, on occasions, lead daily Christian devotionals and times of worship for the staff team.
- Attend TLG's Staff Conference three times a year. This includes active participation in corporate Christian prayer and worship and the opportunity to share faith testimonies of young people involved in TLG's programmes.
- Be prepared and willing to represent TLG at external events, including Christian exhibitions and festivals, church talks, etc.
- Actively promote TLG's regular giving scheme and recruit a number of individuals to become regular 'Hope Givers'
- Take on additional responsibilities for tasks as the role adapts.
