
SENIOR YOUTH WORKER BUS PROJECT EAST HACKNEY | TOWER HAMLETS | NEWHAM

XLP is a vibrant youth work charity dedicated to shaping bright futures for young people. Leading the charge against poverty and educational failure in inner London, we offer holistic, long-term support to 11 to 25 year olds in both schools and communities.

Our buses act as Mobile Youth Centres and provide a unique and rare platform to engage with young people on a weekly basis. They enable a team of experienced youth workers to provide a range of services for young people. Whether table tennis or trivial pursuit, cooking or competitions, games consoles or group discussions, FIFA or Forza, we use our buses to help London's young people create their positive future. We pride ourselves on being able to provide a safe and consistent environment where young people can grow. We use mobile youth centres to offer them further opportunities to gain new experiences and develop their skills, helping them create their positive futures.

We're looking for a youth worker who'll also be responsible for driving one of our buses to and from projects. The role reports directly to the Youth Work Manager - Outreach and work closely with the area based Senior Youth Workers.

Applicants must be over 21 years of age and hold a clean driving licence for minimum of two years. Bus driver training will be provided.

Not only do we see their struggle and their circumstances, but we see their potential. In them, we see talent, we see skill, we see courage.





- Deliver the youth work personally, including regular weekly sessions, activities and trips;
- Work with the area youth workers and managers to identify the types of activity that are appropriate to the context of each community;
- Carry out home visits to families to deliver 1:1 support sessions;
- Help the team to create appropriate 1:1 relationships with young people and their families;
- Deliver detached community-based youth work.
- Regular driving of the bus to and from its base of operations and the community locations;
- Detailed planning and coordination of all the bus facilities and the programme of activities for your assigned projects;
- Ensure that all project activities for which you are responsible are delivered in accordance with agreed health and safety, equal opportunities, and safeguarding policy and procedures.

- Work with the Volunteer Manager and youth workers to lead, motivate and support teams of volunteers and apprentices to deliver the work within their respective areas;
- Monitor and supervise the team member's activities, feeding back positive encouragement where appropriate, and working with them to address and overcome any issues or challenges.

- Identify new opportunities to enhance or develop the provision, taking a key role in the planning and development of new activities and locations in your boroughs;
- Develop project resources and build team to deliver the project to its beneficiaries effectively and efficiently;

- Support the delivery of training alongside the Outreach Youth Work Manager when required.

- Ensure that quality and performance monitoring information is gathered and reported in a timely manner via our systems;
- Use data to continually assess where improvements can be made to the project delivery;
- Undertake community surveys to assess the impact of the project in the local area.

- In collaboration with the Youth Work Manager, develop effective relationships with community stakeholders and other organisations, including councillors, teachers, the police, church leaders, youth leaders, parents and young people);
- Liaise with other agencies that may complement or extend the work XLP provides.
