

Volunteer Role: Transcriber

Role Purpose

As a Volunteer Transcriber, you will play a vital role in ensuring the voices of our veterans are preserved for future generations. You will transcribe audio interviews into accurate, high-quality written records that are accessible, readable, and valuable for educational and research purposes.

Many of the interviews already feature Al-generated transcripts, but these lack the nuance and accuracy that only a human touch can provide. By transcribing interviews, you will enhance the quality of our archive and help honour the experiences of the veterans we serve.

Key Responsibilities

- Listen carefully to audio interviews (provided as MP3 files).
- Transcribe spoken words into a written format with as much accuracy as possible.
- Use punctuation and formatting to improve readability and accessibility.
- Submit completed transcripts to Legasee within the agreed timeframe.

Skills and Experience Required

- · Excellent listening and typing skills.
- Strong attention to detail and a commitment to accuracy.
- Good command of English grammar, spelling, and punctuation.
- Ability to work independently and meet deadlines.

Desirable (but not essential):

- Familiarity with transcription tools or software.
- Interest in military history or oral history projects.

Time Commitment

This role is flexible and remote. Volunteers typically commit between 4 and 6 hours per week.

- Contribute to the preservation of veterans' stories for future generations.
- Develop or enhance your transcription skills.
- Be part of a meaningful project with a tangible impact.
- Gain insight into the lived experiences of military veterans.
