



















AN INTRODUCTION TO BIRCHALL

We were established in 1991 as a community response to the lack of support for people impacted by rape and sexual abuse in the local area. Over the past 33 years we have developed an holistic service supporting anyone over the age of 4 across Cumbria and Lancashire who has been affected by these issues.

We provide trauma informed counselling and wellbeing services, alongside peer support groups and family collaboration services. We deliver prevention services, raising awareness and education through community engagement, schools work and a training offer.

Each year we campaign, fundraise and offer educational programmes as well as wellbeing services and group work activity sessions.

We are committed to the highest standards of governance as a Trustee Board and we will ensure you have the training and support to participate fully and to feel prepared and empowered as a Trustee.

We have a challenging strategic plan but wow what a difference we can make to individuals and communities if we achieve that.



The Birchall Trust Board of Trustees is responsible for the charity's strategy and financial security. While day to day running of the organisation is delegated to our Chief Executive Vanessa Dixon, supported by a senior leadership team, trustees are ultimately legally accountable.

As a Board we meet quarterly with various sub groups that work on key project streams in between.

Trustees are also encouraged to engage in team away days where appropriate.

Trustees are also be expected to participate in Trauma Informed principles and Safeguarding training while other training events may be open to board members.

A flexible approach is taken to meeting arrangements. Where possible face to face meetings are preferred, but virtual meetings may be arranged to facilitate individual circumstances.

ROLE SPECIFICATION

The main criteria we are looking for is someone who is enthusiastic about the work we do here at Birchall and is keen to get stuck into being on a board. We know that this will mean you will come with great ideas and thoughts. As a trustee, some of the things you could support us with are:

- Championing our vision to live in a world free of rape, sexual abuse and sexualised violence
- Be involved in various sub committees, bringing your expertise and knowledge
- Support our financial planning and accounts
- Monitor the risks to the organisation and ensure we are putting in steps to manage them
- Grow the voice of people with lived experience within our governance
- Understand and accept the legal duties, responsibilities and liabilities of being a trustee (we can organise training for this)
- Lead on making sure the Birchall is well governed and complies with its constitutional and charitable objectives

We're not expecting you to do all of these things, but if there is anything on this list that speaks to you or sparks your interest, and you feel passionate about what we do and want to get stuck in, We would love to hear from you.
