
The Miscarriage Association acknowledges the distress associated with pregnancy loss and strives to make a positive difference to those it affects.

I became Chair in 2021 and am one of nine trustees who are responsible for the M.A.'s strategic direction and governance and who are all deeply committed to helping the M.A. achieve its aims. Our role as Trustees is to ensure the charity is well-run, to focus on strategic issues and to act as a critical friend to the wonderful staff team who work so hard to achieve the M.A.'s vision. We are a Board of diverse skills and experiences and everyone's input is valued.

You'll be joining us at a very exciting time for the M.A. The board of Trustees has recently committed to significantly growing the charity to reach and support even more people at this often deeply upsetting time. We are a national charity which provides support and information to anyone affected by pregnancy loss.

We run a staffed helpline, live chat and email service and online and in-person peer support groups.

We promote best care, working with the NHS and other health professionals, contribute to research and development and work to raise general awareness of the impact of pregnancy loss.

We offer training and consultancy services in both the healthcare and workplace settings.

Why we exist

Between **one** in **four** and **one** in **five**pregnancies is estimated to end in miscarriage

A further 1 in 80 is ectopic - a potentially life-threatening condition

And 1 in 600 is a molar pregnancy, requiring specialist care and follow up



The role of a trustee:

Responsibilities

- Attend Board and Committee meetings
- Act in the best interests of the charity and declare all potential conflicts of interest, including seeking approval if invited to serve on another board of Trustees
- Contribute to, and understand, the strategic direction of M.A., its values, strategy, risk management and financing structure
- Keep progress on the implementation of the agreed strategies, plans and budgets under review, holding senior management personnel to account
- Take part in governance review exercises and attend training sessions if, when, or as appropriate

The role of a trustee:

Qualities

- An understanding of the diverse impact of pregnancy loss and a commitment to the M.A's values and vision
- Strategic vision and ability to think creatively
- Good, independent judgement and a willingness to speak your mind
- Willingness and ability to devote the necessary time and effort
- Understanding of the legal duties, responsibilities, and liabilities of Trusteeship
- Ability to work effectively as a member of a team and respect the views of others
- Willingness to be available to staff for advice and enquiries on an ad hoc basis

The role of a trustee:

Terms of Service

- Trustees are appointed for a 3 year term of office, renewal for 2 further terms to a maximum of 9 years
- This is a voluntary position, but reasonable expenses will be reimbursed



Who we're looking for

Experience and skills

At this time, we are particularly looking for new trustees with experience of the charity sector, especially in:

- Governance
- Strategy
- Income generation
- Campaigning
- Advocacy

We are also keen to recruit a trustee with clinical healthcare experience - this could be in primary or secondary care.

However, we would be very happy to hear from anyone with a passion for the cause and who feels they could add value to the board and the charity.

Time commitment

- Attending quarterly board meetings, currently held in person on Saturdays in central London from 11am - 4pm. Accommodation can be made for occasional remote attendance
- Attending additional online meetings as required, e.g. annual accounts review and subcommittees
- Occasional one-off online meetings or emails
