Team Leader(s) – Role Description

You will have a grasp of how democracy and political systems operate. You will understand the importance of advocacy and how the TSA can benefit from being at the forefront of policy making from the top of our movement all the way to group level. This knowledge will help you take the team forward and make a lasting positive impact.

Here's a brief overview of how the Team Leader role might look:

- DRIVER: To be the main volunteer contact for Advocacy issues for Public Affairs staff and volunteers.
- RELATIONSHIP BUILDER: Build a team around you to help volunteers demystify local government and understand how building relationships can unlock more benefits for young people in Scouts.
- DETECTIVE: Explore how we can influence and shape the agenda within TSA's Charitable Objectives
- SUPPORTER: Help young people, passionate about issues to bring them to the attention of decision makers. This includes line managing our pool of 10-15 youth advocates who represent Scouts in some political events such as roundtables where a young person's voice is requested.

Once your team is recruited, you'll help support Counties and Groups across the country to navigate local influencing and advocacy, making closer connections with national activity. You will be able to do this by considering:

- How tasks are shared among Team Members by considering their skills, interests, and availability.
- Ensuring the team is open and inclusive, and includes a range of voices and opinions, and adapt team activities and tasks to be accessible to everyone.
- Having regular team meetings and self-reviews to give everyone a chance to reflect on successes, and plan for the future.
- Building and supporting a team of experts on all aspects of public affairs and advocacy
- Supporting the design of new processes and tools to support local volunteers build their influence
- Ensuring alignment to Scouts values and our charitable objectives.
- Build great relationships with staff and volunteer colleagues to support the team.
- Keep up to date with the latest best practice and news
