The Unpaid Carer's Befriending Project is a partnership project between the Community Volunteering Team and The Unpaid Carers Team at Cardiff Council. This project is looking to recruit a team of volunteers who are passionate about providing friendship and low-level support to Unpaid Carers across Cardiff.				
What we're looking for:				
 Empathetic people who are passionate about providing support to Unpaid Carers; An understanding about who an unpaid carer might be, or a willingness to learn; People who are warm and friendly, and love building relationships with people; People who love learning new things and are committed to finding out more about services that can help people who are unpaid carers; Access to a phone or computer in order to undertake befriending activities; Someone who is able to commit to a regular volunteering day (at least once a week); An ambassador for Cardiff Council, through following relevant policies and procedures.

 An understanding, or willingness to learn, about unpaid carers and who can support them; Volunteers will undergo a DBS check; The ability to fluently speak more than one language is desirable but not essential; The ability to commit to at least 12 sessions working with a carer. 		These will vary according to client need and volunteer preference but will include one or more of the following: - Making weekly phone calls / video calls / home visits to clients to provide friendship; - Signposting clients to services who can support them where relevant; - Going shopping on behalf of the client; - Low level cleaning tasks including dish washing, vacuuming and dusting; - Low level gardening tasks including lawn mowing and watering plants; - Reporting meetings back to your Volunteer Mentor; - Following relevant safety procedures in place for your volunteer role; - Undertaking optional ongoing training relevant to your role; - Meeting with your Volunteer Mentor for debriefs and reflection on the work you're undertaking with your client.

Optional ongoing awareness training from other organisations.
