About Just Like Us

Just Like Us is the LGBT+ young people's charity. Founded in 2016, we work with primary schools, secondary schools and sixth form colleges across the UK to improve the lives of LGBT+ young people. To do that, we run three programmes:

- Ambassador Programme: We train LGBT+ 18 to 25 year olds to speak in secondary schools about growing up LGBT+ and allyship. We support our ambassadors to use their voice, develop skills and find community.
- **School Diversity Week:** We run the UK-wide celebration of LGBT+ equality in primary and secondary schools. We provide free educational resources to thousands of schools, making LGBT+ inclusive education accessible to all.
- Pride Groups: We help secondary schools set up and run lunchtime or after school clubs for LGBT+ and ally pupils to meet, learn and get support

Summary of the role

Just Like Us is the LGBT+ young people's charity and works with thousands of schools and young people across the UK through its programmes. The Ambassador programme is a key part of our work at Just Like Us. This role will be key in ensuring that we have a growing community of LGBT+ young people aged 18-25 who volunteer with Just Like Us. We support them to:

- Use their voice: by delivering school talks, writing for the press and speaking on panels
- Develop their skills: through workshops and mentoring
- Join a community: volunteer with hundred of other LGBT+ young people

This role is critical to the delivery of this mission and will support the Head of Volunteering Programmes to meet the needs of our community of LGBT+ young people aged 18-25 and the schools that we work with.

This role will provide the successful candidate with a strong foundation for a career in the voluntary sector. We are looking for someone who is eager to learn, with strong organisational and administrative skills, and good communication skills to join a friendly, driven Programmes Team.

The Position

Salary: £33,900 p.a.

Permanent, full-time role

Holiday: 25 days (excluding statutory public holidays)

Working pattern: Please note that this role will require some weekend working with volunteers throughout the year, but we will always offer TOIL (time off in lieu)

Location: London (hybrid working - minimum two days a week in the office in London, with some travel around England, Wales and Scotland to deliver training)

Reporting to: Head of Volunteering Programmes

While the role won't be line managing any employees to begin with, we would expect that to change in due course.

What we offer all employees:

- Pension contribution: Just Like Us will match your pension contributions up to 6%
- Flexible working: Just Like Us currently offers a mixed home/office working model, enabling team members to work from home and in the office
- **Professional development**: We are committed to the ongoing professional development of all team members, with an annual training budget per person
- Employee Assistance Programme: Staff can access support in a range of areas, including (but not limited to) - counselling, stress, tenancy and housing, legal support and childcare
- Extra day of annual leave: For each year in post, team members gain an additional day of annual leave, up to a maximum of five

- Lead strategic short, medium and long term project planning across programmes
- Line manage direct reports, where applicable, to achieve their objectives, supporting their wellbeing and professional development
- Track and report on key programme performance goals
- Analyse internal and external data to identify trends, challenges and opportunities
- Meet and exceed performance goals and objectives
- Build and maintain relationships with schools, partners, and community stakeholders in the sector
- Employ a solution-focused approach and engage with professional development

- Support the Senior Leadership Team to shape the strategy of Just Like Us
- Work-cross team to support the Head of Education with School Diversity Week and Pride Group programmes as required

Programme delivery

- Lead and manage the Ambassador and School Talk programmes, using project and programme management principles to deliver projects and programmes to time, to budget and at quality
- Develop our marketing and communication initiatives, coordinating emails and promotional opportunities to expand our reach
- Coordinate the recruitment of volunteers, the delivery of volunteer training and their engagement with volunteer opportunities
- Lead on the development and delivery of Ambassador training and resources
- Coordinate the delivery of the school talk programme including organising and managing volunteers, supporting schools and assisting with the bookings process
- Ensure volunteers to have a fulfilling and engaging experience when volunteering with Just Like Us, ensuring they feel recognised and understand the impact of their contribution
- Ensure programme effectiveness and impact by managing the monitoring and evaluation process, compiling annual reports and gathering case studies
- Represent the charity at conferences and events
- Streamline internal workflows and procedures to enhance efficiency and effectiveness
- Escalate any issues, monitoring risks and ensuring compliance with relevant regulations

- Understanding of LGBT+ communities and LGBT+ young people
- Skills in analysing data, compiling reports, keeping up to date records and streamlining processes
- Skills in time management and managing conflicting priorities
- Employs a solution-focused approach, escalating risks
- An understanding of ensuring compliance across GDPR and Safeguarding
- Experience of running projects and/or programmes, evaluating their effectiveness
- Developing effective relationships with different stakeholders (for example young people, corporate partners, colleagues)

Desirable

- Line management experience
- Experience of working with volunteers
- Experience of working with young people (aged 18-25 years)
- Experience working with systems such as Client Relationship Management,
 Event and email systems (for example, we use Salesforce, Google Drive, Zoom,
 Typeform, Eventbrite but experience with these is not essential)
