Outline of service

Our new Young Carers' Connect project is designed to support the wellbeing of Young Carers' in Wandsworth. The aim of the service is to reduce isolation, promote wellbeing, connect young people and provide opportunities for fun and respite.

Wandsworth Carers' Centre supports individuals who are looking after someone who has an illness or disability. By volunteering with us you can help look after the health and wellbeing of Carers and provide them with the opportunity to take a break from their responsibilities and have time out for themselves.

Outline of Role

As a Young Carers' volunteer, you will have the opportunity to support in a wide range of exciting and dynamic activities such as peer support groups, workshops, events, activities and trips.

Main Responsibilities

- Building rapport with Young Carers and helping them to feel safe and comfortable
- Co-facilitating workshops and groups
- Supporting with the facilitation of trips, events and activities
- Supporting with setting up and tidying up
- Supporting with keeping a record of attendance
- Actively participating in activities, games, events and trips
- Recognising and responding appropriately to safeguarding concerns by reporting to them to the responsible member of staff
- Upholding confidentiality
- Maintaining good communication with responsible staff member.

Other Duties: May be agreed with the responsible staff member as per the requirements of the group.

Code of conduct

As a volunteer, and therefore a representative of the Carers' Centre, you will be expected to comply with this code of conduct.

- 1. Treat all Carers and the people they care for politely and with respect
- 2. Ensure that your appearance is clean, neat and tidy at all times
- 3. Conversations of a personal nature to you should not be had around Carers or the people they Care for
