Organisation purpose:	We Belong exists to ensure young migrants living in the UK are treated equally and fairly in the society they call home. We Belong works with and for young migrants to hold those in power to account and fight for wider reform.		
	We do this by breaking down barriers through direct advocacy, strategic litigation, campaigning, equipping young migrants to be leaders and set agendas within the migration sector. We also provide support by giving accurate information on student finance rules, providing various opportunities and make referrals to organisations for young people to get the legal advice they need.		
Context	We Belong team works exclusively with young people who have migrated to the UK and support young people who are impacted by hostile immigration policies and to enable these young people to challenge these policies themselves.		
Role purpose:	The Youth Development Officer provides quality support for young migrants who have migrated to the UK and are seeking help in accessing higher education, post-education and employment options. The Youth Development Officer will listen to the needs of young people and ensure up to date opportunities are shared when responding to their individual needs. The Youth Development Officer supports by regularly checking in on young people who are affiliated with We Belong and provides a non-judgmental environment in which migrants are able to freely talk about the issues that affect them. The Youth Development Officer also provides accurate information for those who need it and engages young people in various We Belong activities. In addition, the Youth Development Officer will work with schools and colleges across London to raise awareness of the barriers to education and deliver We Belong's Schools Excellence Programme.

- Practice deep listening to identify policy areas that are impacting young people.
- Acting on safeguarding and risk information in line with We Belong policies and procedures.
- Deliver university staff training.
- Deliver assemblies to help raise awareness and promote the work of We Belong in secondary schools and colleges across London.
- Attend careers fairs, secondary schools and colleges across London to help raise awareness and promote the work of We Belong.
- Deliver Schools Excellence Programme.
- Deliver Emerging Young Leaders Programme in collaboration with the London Community Engagement Officer.
- Identify and recruit members for the core group in collaboration with the London Community Engagement Officer.
- Supports London monthly gatherings.
- Encourage, and signpost young people to apply for Sanctuary scholarships offered by universities.
- Provide support and guidance to young people on UCAS applications and personal statements.
- Provide support and guidance to young people on post-education and employment options that include apprenticeships, volunteering or work experience.
- Host young people on work experience at We Belong's London office.

## Partnership and team working

Maintaining effective liaison with colleagues working across We Belong and external organisations including:

- Attending and participating in team meetings and other events including training days.
- Identify cases where policy and campaigning work could be undertaken.
- Communicating with staff members to respond to themes and issues recurring from direct work with young people.
- Collaborate with colleagues to ensure effective support and assistance for young people.
- Contributing frontline experience to We Belong campaigns and sector change work.
- Engaging with the team to support the Annual Youth Summit.
- Networking and building relationship with external professionals and agencies supporting young people e.g. schools, universities, SLC, UCAS and corporates (employability).
- Engaging with and build long-term relationships with universities that result in the creation of scholarships separate to Sanctuary scholarships.
- Initiating relationships with others in the youth sector. For example, by actively participating in youth sector conferences, workshops, or networking events to meet and connect with professionals, proactively reaching out to key stakeholders in the youth sector to explore potential partnerships or collaborations.
- Supporting the delivery of monthly gatherings for young people.
